- Nonattainment Air Quality Planning—Ozone/PM2.5
- Fuel Standards—UltraLow Sulfur Fuel
- EPA's Mobile Source Emission Standards—New Engines (EPA generally has no authority to regulate in-use mobile sources)
 - Cargo Handling--Included in our Nonroad diesel engine standards, phase in 2008-2015 (Tier 4)
 - Trucks--2007 Heavy Duty Diesel Standards
 - Harbor Craft--Category 1 & 2 Marine, Dec. 2007
 - Locomotives-Tier 3 & 4, Dec. 2007
 - Ocean Going Vessels—Category 3 Engines—ANPRM Soon
- International
 - Marpol Annex VI Ratification
 - Proposed Amendments
 - Sox Emission Control Areas (SECA's)

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2. What Incentive Programs does EPA have in Place (relevant to the MAQIP effort)?

- West Coast Collaborative—Forum and Funding to reduce diesel emissions from various sources, including marine.
- West Oakland Toxic Reduction Collaborative (WOTRC)
- Local Scale Air Toxics Monitoring—
 - BAAQMD
- USEPA Ports Strategy



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3. What Funding Sources can EPA Provide or Leverage to Support New Incentive Programs Developed in the MAQIP Process?

- Diesel Emission Reduction Act (DERA) Authorization
 - \$1 billion over 5 years
 - Expect to fund 150-200 projects
 - 70% for EPA grants and loans
 - 20% of the funds to establish State grant/loan programs
 - An optional 10% of the funds can be used to increase state allocations
 - for states that match federal funds
- Fleet Modernization and Idle Reduction
 - \$100 million over 3 years (focus on ports)
 - \$140 million over 3 years for idle reduction
- FY08 EPA Appropriation Pending in Congress
- WCC Request For Proposal Early November 2007
 - \$500,000 for diesel projects (AZ, NV, HI, and CA)
